- To develop confidence in interacting with the teacher and peer.

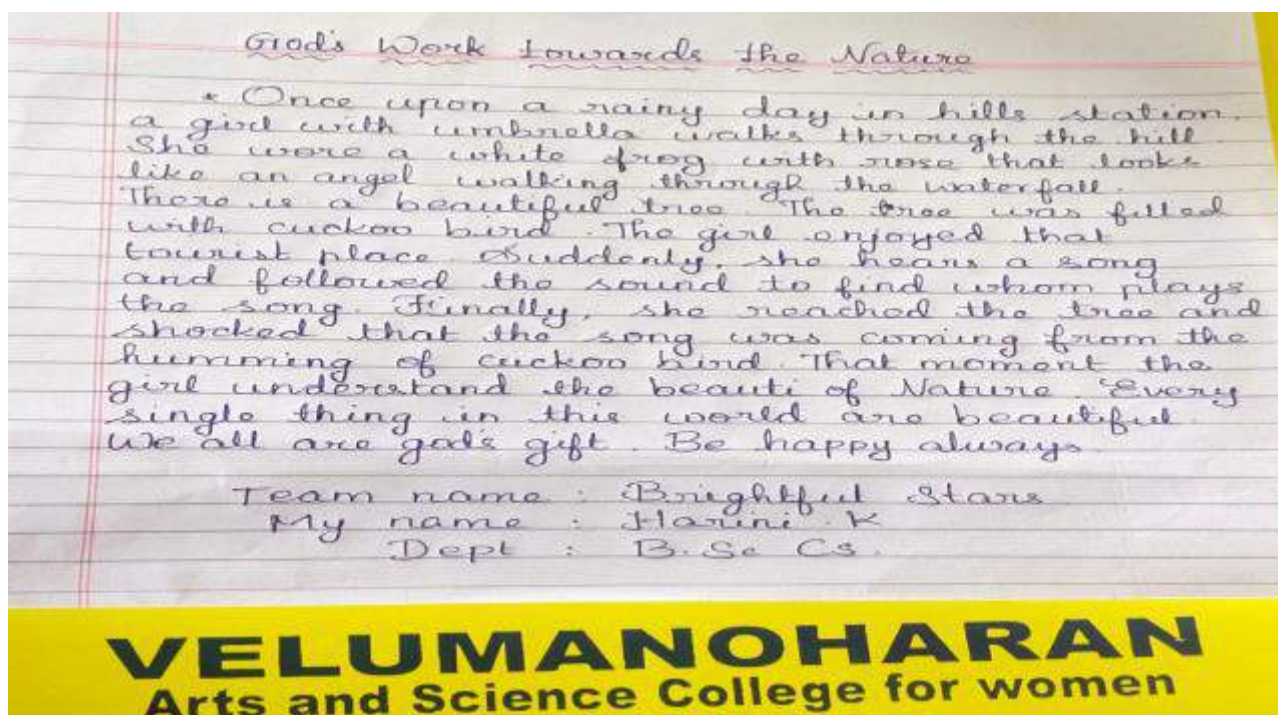
